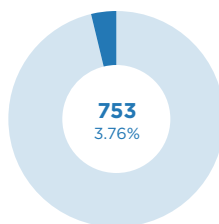
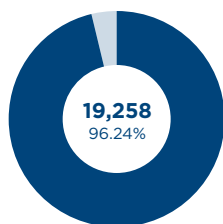

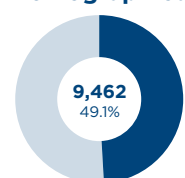

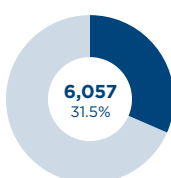

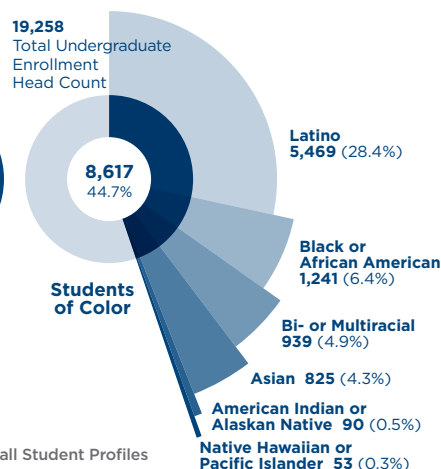
Fall 2018 Undergraduate Student Demographics

MSU Denver works with community and business leaders to identify areas of highest demand and tailor educational programs to fit those demands. It's a win-win – students get relevant skills to launch their careers, and industry benefits from a highly trained workforce.



A new cooperative program with Colorado industry prepares the next generation of manufacturing professionals, engineers, product designers and computer specialists. The Advanced Manufacturing Sciences Institute was developed in partnership with Colorado-based companies, including Lockheed Martin Space Systems Corp., Hartwig Inc. and York Space Systems. It is housed in our new Aerospace and Engineering Sciences Building and combines the curricula of several disciplines.



The Classroom to Career Hub, the latest innovative venture from MSU Denver, will connect students and employers, facilitating real-world learning experiences and upskilling homegrown talent for Colorado's workforce. More than a traditional career center, the Classroom to Career Hub strengthens students' academic and professional acumen through strategic and robust partnerships with local industries and communities. Upskilling local talent means less cost for companies and better career outcomes for students. As the university where most graduates remain in Colorado, MSU Denver is best-positioned to answer workforce demands.



With the largest hospitality program within 400 miles, students in the Hospitality, Events and Tourism program get unrivaled hands-on experience they might not get anywhere else. They can help manage SpringHill Suites Denver Downtown, which is connected to MSU Denver's Hospitality Learning Center. Partnering with the Tivoli Brewing Co. in our on-campus brewery, the Craft Brewing and Pub Operations degree programs offer students opportunities to train with beer experts from across Colorado.



Designed to prepare students to enter health-related careers, the Health Institute will start by building low- to no-cost initiatives including a permanent advisory board, a user-friendly website that integrates all health-related majors and events for students and graduates in health fields. Students interested in health-related fields also will benefit from a strategic advising approach that includes course work, financial aid and career planning. The University also plans to grow the Healthcare Interest Program – a partnership with Denver Health that features a mentoring program for students from disadvantaged backgrounds.
